Collections

Working directly with database programs, artwork, and research engines are integral to this internship. Interns will gain valuable experience working with fine art objects from our permanent collection and develop skills in historical research, as well as photographing and recording work using a professional museum database. They will also refine their professional and technical writing skills as they create catalog entries for upcoming exhibitions.

Installation

Interns will gain hands-on experience in the practical aspects of exhibition installation. They will learn the basics of matting and framing and proper art handling procedures, including how best to wrap and crate work for travel. They will also fully participate in the arrangement of an installation and learn how to correctly hang an exhibit.

Visitor Services, Public Relations, and Media

Museum interns will engage with our diverse audience in a variety of ways. They will not only greet visitors and develop the knowledge to answer questions relating to the museum's history and the work currently on view, but also delve into the coordination and marketing of shows and other special events. Interns will gain experience using social and traditional media, such as press kits and mailings, to promote the museum.
