This renewable scholarship provides tuition assistance to matriculating students who are descendants of the enslaved members of the Hollins Community (formerly Oldfields). This scholarship will cover any remaining tuition costs after other institutional and state aid is applied. To be considered, applicants must be admissible to the university and demonstrate their family connection with documentation. Recipients must maintain satisfactory academic progress to continue to receive the award.*
